#### ROTC/JROTC UPDATE



MG Rapp comes to us from his assignment as Chief, Legislative Affairs on the Army Staff in Washington. MG Rapp is a 1984 West Point graduate (First Captain of the Corps of Cadets), commissioned in the Corps of Engineers and a 2004 graduate of the US Army War College. 
