♦ Speaker: Dan Cooper

CAPTAIN Paul Tortora, USN (ret), is the Director of the Center for Cyber Security Studies and was the first Chair of the new Cyber Science Department at the United States Naval Academy. Paul recently re-



tired from the Navy following a 26-year active duty career as both a Nuclear Submarine Officer and a Naval Intelligence Officer. During his active service he served and deployed on two nuclear fast attack submarines, two amphibious assault ships, and a nuclear aircraft carrier, conducting peacetime and combat operations across the globe. His ashore assignments included Director of Training at the Navy and Marine Corps Intelligence Training Center, on the staff of the Director of Naval Intelligence, as the Intelligence Officer and Naval Aide to the Secretary of the Navy, and on the staff of the Office of the Director of National Intelligence. Paul is a 1989 graduate of the Naval Academy, where he majored in Mathematics, minoring in Spanish. He holds a Masters of Science in Management from the University of Maryland, and a Masters of Arts in National Security Strategy from the Naval War College. His personal awards include the Legion of Merit, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, and the Meritorious Service Medal. He is a recipient of both the National Military Intelligence Association's Vice Admiral Rufus Taylor Award for Intelligence Leadership and the Rear Admiral Edwin T. Layton Award for outstanding leadership in Naval Intelligence. Paul will be speaking to us about cyber



security in today's military within the scope of available information to the public. This is should be a very interesting topic as it is the subject of daily news.

⇒ PENNSYLVANIA LEGISLATURE

Act 66 of 2007 Veterans' Service Officer Program: By Keith Beebe, MOAA PA Council 2 VP/PA War Veteran's Council Legislative Chair & Bob Gray, PWVC Legislative Committee member

One of the legislative goals for the PA War Veterans Council, the State Veteran's Commission and MOAA PACOC over the past five years has been to get an increase in funding for the Act 66 Service Officer Program. The program started as a way to expand outreach to veterans across the state to file for VA benefits from their time in service. This was a cost saving to the state as it could not budget the additional service officers in DMVA needed to reach more veterans. The legislation passed in 2007 and the program started in 2008. Program costs have increased and the salary of the service officers has never been increased since the program started in 2008 due to reduced funding by the legislature since the start of the program.

Legislators saw the value in increasing veteran service officers and increasing pay to prevent turnover as a result of the Pennsylvania War Veterans Council Legislative Committee Act 66 work group. Over the past two years the work group has presented power point presentations to legislators at a joint House and Senate Veterans Affairs information meeting and this year met with legislators, the Governor's office and DMVA to make sure the increase was in the Governor's budget.



Last year it was in the Governor's budget but was cut during the budget process as revenue was very short. This year it was in the Governor's budget again and was initially cut by the House Budget Committee before the budget hearings. Once the final budget was agreed upon the \$500,000.00 increase was finally approved for the Act 66 Veteran's Service Officer Program.

The fact that the legislature had more revenue this year was a favorable factor but it was the behind the scenes work of the Act 66 work group that kept the pressure on the legislature and informed the governor's office of the impact for the stat's veterans that kept the issue on the table.

Adopt A Kid/Adopt A Vet: John Gareis

This fall I have scheduled two Adopt a Kid/Adopt a Vet programs for Central Manor Elementary and Mountville Elementary.

We will visit Mountville Elementary School on 7 November and speak with sixth grade students. The follow up assembly will be on 15 November.

We then visit Central Manor Elementary on 8 and 9 November to speak to fifth and sixth graders. A follow-up assembly will be on 19 November.


