The American Legion National Commander Is Coming to Central PA

LINGLESTOWN, PA, February 19, 2013- American Legion Post 272 announces it is hosting a Reception and Dinner in of Honor James E. Koutz, the National Commander of The American Legion. The event will take place at Post 272 on Tuesday, March 12, 2014; the Reception is at 6 PM, followed by dinner at 7 PM. State Senator Rob Teplitz and State Representative Ron Marisco are among several of the VIPs who are attending; they will present Senate and House Proclamations.

Koutz in his capacity as Commander serves as the chief executive officer and official spokesman of The American Legion, which is the nation's largest and most influential network of U.S. Wartime Veterans, families, and communities. Locally in Cumberland, Dauphin, Lebanon, and Perry Counties there are 57 Posts, with over 15,000 members. People associated with the American Legion in Central Pennsylvania including family members would swell to over 40,000. However, according to Census Bureau statistics for 2012, there were 61,314 veterans in the four-county area. Veterans and family members of all Veterans in Central Pennsylvania number about 150,000 people – that is the reason for the National Commander of the American Legion is visiting Central Pennsylvania – to let those Veterans know that he cares about them and their families, and that he represents their interests!

The American Legion National Commander is the one person most routinely relied upon by the President and the U.S. Congress for guidance on matters relating to veterans. Because The American Legion is federally chartered, it has enabled it to influence considerable social change in America over the years; win hundreds of benefits for veterans, and produce many important programs for children and youth. Following are a just few of the many significant accomplishments in Legion history: Aug. 9, 1921, The Legion's efforts result in the creation of the U.S. Veterans Bureau, forerunner of the Veterans Administration; Dec. 15, 1943, Past National Commander Harry W. Colmery starts to write in longhand the first draft of what will later become the "GI Bill of Rights"—considered the Legion's single greatest legislative achievement; and June 22, 1944, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signs into law the original GI Bill.

The American Legion- was chartered by Congress in 1919 and today it has 2.4 million members.

The Department of Pennsylvania American Legion- which is one of 55 Departments, is headquartered in nearby Wormleysburg, and has the largest membership of all the Departments.

Robert H. Hoke, Post 272, Linglestown- is one of the largest American Legion Posts in Central Pennsylvania, with approximately 800 active members.

MOAA Connect interactive website established for Keystone Capital Chapter

The Keystone Capital Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America now has an interactive website established for its chapter members.

The website is designed to provide an interactive means to communicate among and provide information to chapter members. It contains the ability to establish member profiles and several means to stay in touch including a Communities section for those with similar interests; a Contacts section where you can invite individual members to become a part of your contacts list; a Subscriptions section for news from the Communities; and a Favorites section to establish a list of documents.

DIRECTIONS TO THE RADISSON HOTEL, CAMP HILL

1150 Camp Hill Bypass Camp Hill, PA 17011

The meeting is inside the <u>Main Hotel</u>, which is the <u>lower building</u>. You may park in the parking spots in front of the main hotel.

Do not go into the Convention Center at the top of the property.

From the East Shore: Take I-83 South straight onto PA Route 581 then exit right onto Route I5 North. Follow route I5 through Camp Hill to the traffic light by Holy Spirit Hospital. Keep to the Right after the intersection to go to the hotel, it is on the left at the top of the hill. (The main bypass goes to the left and down the hill into Harrisburg, stay right.)

*** If you do go down the hill take the first right and it will bring you to Erford Road, turn right and take first right into Hotel parking lot. Go to lower building, that is the hotel entrance.

From the East Shore: Take I-81 across the Susquehanna and take the first exit to Route I5 South. Travel to Wormlesburg and follow the right turn sign for Route I5 at the light, then proceed up the hill and the Radisson will be on your right. You can turn right at the light by the IHOP restaurant or continue to the next light at the top of the hill and turn right into the hotel. You can drive down to the lower hotel building to park.

From Harrisburg: Cross the Harvey Taylor Bridge and continue up the hill on the Camp Hill Bypass. Take the first exit onto Erford Road, turn left and the hotel will be on your right.

From the West Shore: Drive to Route 15 North, Camp Hill. Follow Route 15 through Camp Hill to the traffic light by Holy Spirit Hospital. Keep to the Right after the intersection to go to the hotel, it is on the left at the top of the hill. (The main bypass goes to the left and down the hill into Harrisburg, stay right.) **** See asterisks Above
