PRESIDENT'S CORNER By Michael Zang

There was a very nice turnout for the first luncheon event of 2017. Sixty-one members and guests joined us for our meeting at Carlisle Country Club. Mr. **Stephen Focht** provided very relevant and critical information on "*Your Heart and You*." He reviewed the common heart risk factors of being overweight, stress, not exercising, high cholesterol, and high blood pressure before discussing some of the heart attack symptoms for both men and women. Stephen strongly recommended that everyone should be aware of these symptoms and not ignore any of them.

He emphasized that if you suspect you are having a heart attack to follow these basic steps:

- 1. Stop doing whatever you are doing.
- 2 CALL 911
- 3. Take any heart medication you may have. If you have none then chew an uncoated aspirin.
- 4. Unlock any doors to your home, as EMTs are not allowed to break down doors.
- 5. Loosen any tight clothing.
- 6. Get into a more comfortable position so you can breathe more easily.

Stephen's presentation was a good reminder to all of us on how to take care of our heart and what to do if we suspect we are having heart trouble.

I want to personally thank both the former and new officers, members of the Board, and committee representatives for agreeing to serve in these

positions. It is these individuals who make my job as President easy and enable your Chapter to provide great support to Dickinson College and Shippensburg University's ROTC programs and to the six JROTC programs (Carson Long, Cedar Cliff, Chambersburg, Cumberland Valley, Gettysburg, and Red Land). VA Claims Connected to Camp Lejeune, Water Contamination:


A new VA regulation will grant disability compensation to veterans suffering from conditions caused by exposure to contaminated water in Camp Lejeune, N.C., between Aug.1, 1953, and Dec. 31, 1987.

The new regulation takes effect March 14, 2017 and presumes the following conditions were caused by the contaminated water exposure for people who served there: kidney cancer, liver cancer, Non-Hodgkin lymphoma, adult leukemia, multiple myeloma, Parkinson's disease, aplastic anemia and other myelodysplastic syndromes, and bladder cancer.

Veterans who were at Camp Lejeune for at least 30 days (consecutively or non-consecutively) between Aug.1953 and Dec. 1987, and who have been diagnosed with one or more of the above conditions may receive presumptive service connection for their disability. Veterans must file a VA disability claim in order to receive the benefits. The new rule will also be applied to any claims currently pending before the VA.

When he was re-elected to a second term, Lincoln gave what I believe is one of the most important speeches ever spoken in America. So important was this speech that it was carved into the marble of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, DC. He concluded his second inaugural address with these words:

With malice toward none, with charity for all, with firmness in the right as God gives us to see the right, let us strive on to finish the work we are in, to bind up the nation's wounds, to care for him who shall have borne the battle and for his widow and his orphan, to do all which may achieve and cherish a just and lasting peace among ourselves and with all nations.

In the 152 years since this address, we can still learn from this great and humble man. It is time to reset our azimuths, to remember our duty and devotion as veterans, and to seek that which heals the nation and makes us stronger. Above all, we are reminded to pray for the health of our nation, and for divine guidance needed by our elected officials. Let there be peace on earth, and may it begin with each of us.

Is that too much to ask? Honest Abe did not believe it was!


Menu:
