specializing in providing renovations that improve the lives of individuals with accessibility needs. Mr. Swartz will discuss Aging-in- Place. This is a term used to describe a person living in the residence of their choice, for as long as they are able, as they age. He will provide insight into how you can remain in your home safely, independently, and comfortably as your ability levels change due to age and/or disability. Aging-in- Place may require different levels of home modifications; some as simple as installing handrails or grab bars, while other modifications can include remodeling an entire house for wheelchair accessibility.
