Chapter Finishes Major Stand-up Actions

As the one year anniversary of York Chapter nears, its board elected during the MOAA National-PA Council of Chapters meeting at the York Hotel, last July. completed major actions it undertook that were essential to restart the chapter. The board itself has met eight times in either face-to-face meetings or via conference calls. The board initial objectives were to (1) consolidate itself and get responsibilities parsed-out and working (2) build membership (3) start holding credible general

membership meetings. As modest as these objectives were, it took work and application of a lot of experience and lessons learned to get a chapter posture and momentum developed to sustain member and community-focused core activities. John Antonitis, chapter president characterized process: "...I think the gang on the board would agree its activities geared to get things rolling were/are rewarding and enjoyable. Just the fact that everyone was a retired officerwhose spouses also

pitched-in—allowed folks to interact in a familiar "zone" known to military and their families. Additionally the number of persons who called and volunteered to help underscores the pleasure of working with folks who have 'been there' in terms of responsibility and service." PA Veterans Auto License Plates Support PA Vets

Other Plates Also Available for Residents with Military Credentials

The Veterans' Trust Fund (VTF) administered by the PA Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMVA), provides funding to assist and support Pennsylvania veterans and their families. The VTF will issue grants to statewide charitable organizations that assist veterans, veterans service organizations and county directors of veterans affairs. The

fund can assist veterans in need of shelter and with necessities of living

The next time you apply for or renew your Pennsylvania driver's license or photo ID or renew your motor vehicle registration, you will have an opportunity to make a \$3 tax-deductible contribution to the VTF. You don't need to be a veteran to show your support of veterans by purchasing the "Honoring erans" license plate. This plate is available for passenger cars and light

trucks up to 10,000 pounds and costs \$35. Fifteen dollars from the sale of each license plate goes to the VTF. How to get Vet Designation on PA Driver's License





Qualified applicants should visit www.dmv.state.pa.us and click on the AmericanFlag icon visit the phrase "Veterans Designation" beneath it. Applicants will be given the opportunity to renew or order a duplicate driver's license or identification card which will contain the designation. Your current photo in Penn Dot files will be used for online and mail requests. Veterans must selfcertify they area veteran. Misrepresentation of veteran's status will result in losing one's driver's license or ID card. DMVA will audit submissions to verify veteran status of discharge or separation under conditions other than dishonorable. Those applications not able to be verified will be sent a letter from DMVA requesting a copy of the veteran's DD 214. This will actually aid veterans in obtaining a copy if they do not have one and receive assistance in obtaining it. DMVA may not have electronic access to a veteran's records if they have no tused the GI Bill or VA services. // Info from DMV Website. Cost was \$30.00 on 30 June 2014.
