### Liberty Bell Competition

In the awards corner now all the buzz is dedicated to preparations for our Liberty Bell Trophy Competition.

Schools from two levels participate:

At the university/college level ROTC units from five schools nominate their best candidates who submit essays and complete detailed applications. The candidates are interviewed by a panel of chapter members for about an hour, and the panel members score their credentials in ten categories. The candidate who earns the highest average score is recommended to the chapter's board of directors as the Liberty Bell Trophy winner. The trophy is kept at the winner's school for one year, and the winner takes home a check for \$1200.

At the high school level seven local JROTC units are invited to nominate

## Will Conley's Legislative Corner

In the October 2017 edition of *The Military Officer*, it is pointed out that consistent attempts are being made to reduce benefits, services, and support to military service members and their families. "The topics of reduced pay raises, reduced housing allowances, and increased TRICARE enrollment fees and pharmacy co-payments are brought up in discussions on Capitol Hill because some believe we pay the military too much and those who serve should pay more for their health care". As an example, a report

in the September 2017 edition of the Military Officer, notes that: "The Senate aligned itself with DOD's budget request to increase pharmacy USN; Robert Schoemer, CPT, ARNG;

copayments and repeal a grandfathered TRICARE fee structure, arguing the latter was too confusing and costly." The House, fortunately, chose to stick with the current TRICARE fee structure, which prevents disproportional fee increases from being foisted onto military beneficiaries. Resolution of the issue awaits the outcome of ongoing Senate –House Armed Services Committees conferences. MOAA's position: Oppose the Senate position. Congress must live up to its commitment to the troops. And MOAA needs our help. Every Email, letter, or phone call to our Legislators helps.
