PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Some tidbits from the State Veterans Commission meeting held on Sept. 6:

- Beginning in November you will be able to contribute \$3 to the Veterans Trust Funds when you renew your driver's license.
- A Trust Fund lottery ticket is being discussed on Capitol Hill, stay tuned.
- A mental health forum will be conducted by the Dept. of Public Welfare on Nov. 6-7 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Harrisburg. The forum will provide educational and practical resources for redeploying veterans and their families. For more info contact the welfare department.
- As of July 30 some \$3.4 million has been paid to more than 10,000 Persian Gulf War bonus claimants. The average turnaround is 4.3 days!

Susan and I had a great time dining with General Greene Chapter members on Sept. 19. Not only did we stay at a hotel on Arnold Palmer Drive but we ate at a terrific restaurant in the Arnold Palmer Regional Airport! Guess we know who's the VIP in that city. Some 28 members and spouses attended. It was good seeing former council president Chuck Anderson, whose better half Nancy serves as our council secretary as well as the Chapter president. I also had a nice chat with former council member Dick Flock and found another member who served as a "tac" officer in the PA Guard OCS program several years after I graduated, so we had many friends in common. We visit the Pittsburgh Chapter next month and the PM/NE PA

Chapter in December, so my goal of visiting every Chapter during my term will have been reached. More on that later.

Some bullets gleaned from the Hershey symposium held Sept. 26-28:

- You can now sign up for text alerts from MOAA National.
- MOAA's strength is holding steady at about 380,000 while other national VSOs are losing members.
- Beginning in 2014, MOAA will be offering three types of memberships: basic (electronic only, no dues, only good until you are 35); premium (formerly the regular membership, you pay dues annually, get magazine, etc.), and life (same as before).
- MOAA's goal is to have every Congressional district covered by a MOAA Chapter and they will begin offering legislative liaison training sessions at the SE regional symposium being held in FL. Because it was too late for the Hershey symposium, they will set up minitraining sessions in the NE in the next 18 months. I urge you to form a Chapter legislative committee if you haven't already done so.
- USAA continues to provide \$500 annually to any Chapter that applies; funds can be for operations or programs, and USDAA will donate \$1000 for state conventions.
- The gold bar program will be retained.
- MOAA will provide any Chapter up to \$250 for print media ad

- placement, and provides ad slicks that can be tailored for Chapters. This offer runs out this CY!
- Next year MOAA will provide a web site that permits Chapters to collect dues online and will continue to send Chapters \$10 for every new member and that includes surviving spouses.
- To qualify for incentives, Chapter rosters must be received by MOAA National by Feb. 1, 2014.
- When lobbying, one state has their members all wear the same "uniform" since MOAA does not have hats or any distinguishable clothing/ID. They all wear blue sport coats, gray slacks, white shirts and a red tie. Good idea? Let me know.
- Can the State College area support a Chapter? We go there four times a year and could meet with interested officers. Feedback please.

All in al,l a great, as usual, meeting. A best practices recap was included in the handouts which provided info on what Chapters were doing that made them successful. A great read.

Notes from our state council meeting, held in Hershey on September 26:

Jack Whelan agreed to take over our financial chores and we welcome his input to our council. All of the documents were passed to him at the meeting and before the day was out he already had downloaded the files and said everything appeared to be in order, so we're off to a great transition. Jack is going to recommend a state-wide bank we can move our accounts to and move out smartly to get that up and running. He'll be working with incoming

president Bob Gray since the two of them will have signature authority for the new accounts.

Speaking of finances, the council approved the CY 2014 budget, copy attached for your info. As always, a budget is a living entity so your input is continuously welcome. Part of this budget is advertising income for this newsletter. I have emailed our national legal advisor to get a few technical questions answered, and will move out smartly once these technicalities are worked through. Remember that the council has already approved selling advertising in an earlier meeting, and approval of the budget reinforces that OK. I'll keep you informed as we head into these uncharted waters. Keep in mind that I use a monthly circulation figure of 1,000, which is based on you emailing the newsletters to your members with emails. Please keep in mind that the funds we receive will be used to directly support our Chapters.

Our finances on Sept. 26 showed a checking account balance of \$2618.91 and savings account balance of \$5169.13, so our new worth was \$7788.04 as of that date. I mentioned that due to the treasurer transition the figures were not audited and the new council treasurer will provide a full update at our Nov. 9 meeting in State College.

Our state convention is set for Sept. 12-14 next year at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel, Pittsburgh - Meadow Lands, 340 Racetrack Road, Washington, Pennsylvania, 15301; 724-222-6200. Preliminary costs are \$25 for the Friday evening welcome reception and \$35 for Saturday, which includes refreshments adoring the morning and afternoon sessions and lunch.

Chaired by our Pittsburgh and General Greene Chapters, they are looking for support - contact Nancy Anderson or Carmen DiGiacomo to volunteer. They are especially looking for goodies to put in welcome packets, in quantities of 100.

Our Oliver Hazard Perry Chapter is looking for recruiting help and we agreed to help beginning with their meeting next April. They don't meet in the winter months. Brrrr.

Council meeting dates were set for next year: Jan. 16 (1 p.m., electronic meeting only), April 5, July 19, Sept. 13 and Nov. 8. All council meetings will be held from 11-1 at the State College Days Inn. As usual our council's legislative committee will meet an hour earlier at all of these meetings.
