PRESIDENT'S CORNER By Harold Cooney

Is it the holiday season already? Where did 2014 go? I hope everyone is making their plans to celebrate with friends and family. I hope those plans include joining us at the December Holiday Musicale on December 10th! We had a good crowd at our November meeting with 68 members and guests attending. We welcomed **COL Harry Leach, USAF (Ret),** who is the new Director of Development for the Army War College Foundation (and gave him a membership application!).

Our guest speaker was **Captain Jeffery T. Rathbun, US Navy**, Commander, Naval Support Activity Mechanicsburg that includes three Navy installations: NSA Mechanicsburg, NSA Philadelphia and the Philadelphia Naval Yard Annex. CAPT Rathbun began by highlighting the importance of our military benefits to our active

members, retirees and as a recruiting tool. He thanked MOAA for our work in preserving those benefits.

The Navy's future appears bright, with shipbuilding on track for a 309-ship force by the end of the decade, 60% of which will be focused in the Pacific. CAPT Rathbun discussed the three facilities he has responsibility for. While many of us have been on NSA Mechanicsburg, we probably didn't know that there 122 facilities on the 806 acres with a force of 4500 employees, mostly civilians, that brings \$340M a year in payroll alone to the region. Nor did we know that the Philadelphia Naval Yard, BRAC'd several years ago, still houses the only Navy ship propeller production facility (1200 Navy employees) along with 130 businesses that are part of the redevelopment effort of that space.

Our purpose is to encourage and facilitate camaraderie among active, retired, and former officers of the uniformed services, their spouses and survivors; to provide information to, useful services for, and to protect the interests of, members and their dependents and survivors; to promote the aims of the national MOAA; and to serve the community and the nation.




