The most recent scam looks like a "SmartDoc" email with the subject line "myPay IMPORTANT SECURITY UPDATE" and has a link to a malicious website that asks for personal information. Do not click on any SmartDoc message that contains a quick link or requests you to send information back! That's not the way DFAS does business – be cautious online.

PROGRAM NOTES By Michael Zang

Our speaker for January's luncheon meeting is **LTC Reed Anderson**, a member of the Army War College Class of 2016. His most recent assignment was as the Chief of Attaché Coordination on the Army Staff. His follow-on assignment after graduation will be in Tunisia as the Chief of the Office of Defense Cooperation in the United States Embassy.

The global security environment has drastically changed over the past decade and in particular over the recent three years. Who could have predicted the rise of ISIS and Russia's use of military force in the Crimea and Ukraine? Both threats are putting pressure on Europe and our NATO Allies. How can the United States and NATO deter a revanchist Russia, both against a potential yet unlikely conventional threat and against an ambiguous threat? LTC Anderson will discuss this at our January 13, 2016 Luncheon.

During the course of his presentation he will define key elements to deterrence and suggest ways the United States and NATO should work together, to provide an effective deterrence against Russia in a resource constrained environment, without unduly provoking Russia or returning to the 'security dilemma' of the Cold War.

Our February speaker will be a local physical therapist who will discuss the importance of regular exercise to our overall health and wellness. I look forward to speaking with you at both events.
