PRESIDENT'S CORNER By Harold Cooney

A group of 55 or so hardy souls braved the sub-freezing temperatures to kick off the New Year. Army LTC Reed Anderson, USAWC Class of 2016, joined by his wife Angie, spoke to us about the current state of affairs in Europe and relations between NATO and Russia.

As a Foreign Area Officer (Field Artilleryman) most recently assigned to the Army G-2 (Intelligence), he provided a unique and candid assessment of where we have come since the end of the Cold War, where we are today and what we might expect in the future in the Region. For many of us Cold War veterans, it sounded a lot like the same threat we faced in the 70's and 80's, but with

only a tenth of the US forward deployed forces as we had in theater. LTC Anderson reminded us that the rest of the world doesn't always share our perception of what 'partnership' is, or can be. He made it clear that NATO is probably incapable of fully defending Europe with current troop levels in the member nations. While NATO militaries are on the decline, Russia is building their capability. In our business meeting, we welcomed the new Chapter Board members.




