LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS

The FY 2022 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), signed into law on December 27, 2021, includes several important provisions that improved access to mental health care for military families.

MOAA raised awareness of a Department of Defense (DoD) Inspector General (IG) report highlighting widespread mental health care delays and cost barriers to access for servicemembers and military families during last year's meetings on Capitol Hill. The provisions below will improve access to Mental Health care.

Mental Health Appointment Schedulers

Pilot: This provision requires a minimum one-year pilot to provide direct assistance with mental health appointment scheduling in both military treatment facilities and the TRICARE network of civilian providers.

Report on Impact of Mental Health Copay

Increases: TRICARE copayments for mental health visits and physical, speech, and occupational therapy visits increased dramatically in 2018. Military families and retirees in some cases report the higher copayments made it too expensive to request the care. The NDAA included report language directing DoD to conduct an analysis

comparing utilization rates of mental health visits and physical, speech, and occupational therapy visits before the 2018 increases to evaluate the impact of these increases.




